Hello Fellow Members,

Our current balance is \$3,539.10. We have no donation to report for the Region (that will come next month): leaving us with a balance of \$1,009.10 above our prudent reserve.

I was unable to have a Transaction History at today's meeting. Due to my forgetfulness, I did not get that printout from the bank. I will get the report tomorrow and email it to our Secretary so that it can be included in the minutes. Please note when you view this that I made a mistake on the deposit last month. I grabbed the wrong amount for the total deposit from my calculation sheet so there should be an entry to correct my error. Please see the yellow highlighted entry on the Transaction History. The error in the deposit is shown as an Account Correction in the amount of \$593.68. Again, my apologizes.

Last month I announced and reported that the Financial Audit would take place one hour prior to the follow-up Area Inventory meeting. I have to say that I was quite disappointed in the turnout for this. There were three people in attendance for the meeting: me; our Alternate Treasurer, David; and our RCM, Greg. In August of last year there was a motion passed directing an audit to take place with an 11/2/3 vote. The intent of that motion was "To curtail misappropriation of NA funds and/or prevent mistakes." I have been stating all along that I would be presenting information; I undertook (with David's help) the responsibility to crunch the numbers and provide those results. If you would like, we can setup another date to review the audit. The amount of time it should take to go over these records and answer questions will be approximately one hour.

I have not purchased a copy of Quicken for our Alternate Treasurer as of yet. I hope to have this accomplished by next month.

Area Reports

Central TN – The RCM states that the CRA is alive and sometimes well! They are young and feeling their way through using the traditions and concepts and concepts. They added a new meeting and had their first CAR report workshop. A huge success. Their area recently voted to disband the literature committee, however, this is in the process of being rescinded. They had a PI Learning Day on April 1st. RCM *Ricardo J*.

Chattanooga – They continue to grow- lots of newcomers- lots of birthdays. H & I is holding strong- still needing support. PI- Phone line system staying w/ Bell South and adding 5 minutes to our recording for \$20/ month. CAR workshop went great.

Surrender Under the Stars will be held September 29-30th. They need a Treasurer. Chattanooga area's web site is http://www.nachattanooga.com. Moving area meeting to Cleveland for 6 months to reach out. RCM \mathcal{R} and \mathcal{H} .

Greater Nashville – They have another area inventory coming up in June to complete the one we had in January. They are planning a Learning Day on June 17th. They have a new helpline number 1-888-476-2482. A new group called SNAG has opened in Smyrna. Activities coming up are KISS Kampout May 5, 6, & 7th. Area 27th Anniversary will be held on April 22nd. A Memorial Day picnic will be on May 29th. H & I subcommittee has started the 1st meeting in the women's prison in a very long time. Need women willing to carry the meetings in. *Kim S*.

Greater Smoky Mountain - Participation in H & I is steady. We still have meetings in eight facilities. The amount of information on our area website is growing. The address is www.knoxvillena.org. We have just elected new chairs for the Literature and Phoneline subcommittees. The literature subcommittee has been up and running for years, but it's been a long time since we have had an organized phoneline subcommittee. More to come!

The Recovery on the Ridge subcommittee is up and running. It appears we will have no problem meetings the financial obligations or putting on the annual campvention. Last month we had the first that I know of, area inventory. We spent about four or five hours identifying the problems. We have scheduled the solution finding session for next weekend, April 8, 2006. The GSMA would like tot thank the regional representatives, Lynn S., for facilitating the meeting...and Lynn, Connie and Dale S. for lending us their spiritual support. It was truly a blessing and I myself left the meeting with a deep sense of purpose, hope and gratitude.

We have much work to do in the Greater Smoky Mountain Area, but I think we have taken some first steps. I will be offering a motion in new business to change the Regional Guidelines to require that nominations for regional positions must come from the nominee's home area. I would request that one of the RCMs second this motion. I will also be bringing a nomination for Ken Mc. For VRSC Chair. That nomination also requires a second. The GSMA is donating \$1059.55 to the region. RCM Greg V.

Middle TN. – Had an area inventory on March 18 that raised a lot of concerns and issues. They weren't able to complete the inventory so have scheduled a second session for May 20th. It was a very informative and productive inventory. The atmosphere of recovery was wonderful. It was something that has been missing in our area for a while. There were 9 groups represented at the inventory. Hopefully we will be able to have a full attendance at the next one. There has been nothing but positive feedback regarding the inventory.

There has been a change in our executive board of the MTANA area. Our chair stepped down and our vice chair has stepped up. Trent J. is now the chair of the MTANA, vice chair is now open. Other open positions that we have are: Alt. Secretary, Outreach and Alt. RCM. Karim H. was elected Policy and Procedure chair.

The activities that we have planned are: NA 27^{th} Anniversary Fellowship, which will be held on April 22. There will be a Memorial Day picnic at Shelby Park on May 29^{th} .

Mountain – They lost one group and gain a different one. The second group has been conducting H & I presentation in the Hawkins County Jail. They have decided to join the Area H & I Subcommittee to become more unified in the area and to carry a clearer message of Narcotics Anonymous. PI is preparing to be doing presentation to local judges, probation, DA, etc... On April 6 we are going to revise our area's guidelines from the ground up.

Our area now has an outreach subcommittee its moving forward in a positive direction. Our area is also making a motion or asking the region for help establishing our outreach subcommittee. As an area we are asking for \$467.41 from the region to do this. This is one way we can use our convention as a resource to help us carry the message to the still suffering addict. Upper Cumberland – The current H & I meetings are going well and calls are coming in on the helpline (mostly meeting times and locations). PI has been busy with several projects. The new PSAs were finished are being taken to the local radio stations. The 2 billboards are being moved to Roane and Fentress counties as soon as space becomes available. The website stats are growing rapidly with visits coming in from all over countries all over the world including India, China, Russia to name a few. The Public Information learning day was a big success with several important topics covered including websites, phonelines, presentations, PI and the traditions, etc. There were attendees from all over Volunteer Region as well as Kentucky and Georgia. The mailings to the judicial personnel went out the beginning of February. As of yet there has been no response. The PI Subcommittee is developing ideas to generate a better response including self-addressed stamped envelopes, return postcards, etc RCM Amanda M.

West TN - They held a CAR Workshop in February. Only six addicts showed up.

In the past their area experienced some misappropriation of funds and every since the area gives a report at the end of our area meeting that includes monies that came in as well as disbursements. The motion reads as follows: We are requesting \$6,200.00 for our yearly budget. Monies to be used for literature, all travel, all that is not used will be returned and we do not need full amount at once.

Intent: To fulfill our primary purpose; get PI up and running in the state of TN.

Additional Information

Budget of \$6200.00 projected cost that will incur providing Public Information services to the Volunteer Region. \$3404.22 for literature packets for EVERY P.O.; Judge; etc. / \$397.88 for paper; ink; postage; envelopes. (Remainder for travel (\$0.25) per mile and 1/2 of hotel if needed. Not to exceed \$50.00 per night.



Motion 2

Motion made by Greg V. of the Greater Smoky Mountain Area and seconded by Belinda H. of the Upper Cumberland Area The motion reads as follows: Revise the VRSC Guidelines Article VI: Election of Officers for the VRSC.Section2.Nominations: Modify the text to require that the nominations for VRSC Administrative Committee positions must come from the nominee's home area. The ad-hoc and temporary subcommittee positions would not be affected by this requirement since the VRSC chair appoints them.

Intent: To ensure that persons nominated for regional positions have the support of their home areas. Their home areas should have a clear idea of the individual's qualifications and service record. This is in concert with the Fourth Concept which encourages us to carefully choose our trusted servants.

Discussion Summary

Ken McC read the current policy. One member said that he did not understand the conflict because at their home area they could nominate a member from another group. One member expressed concerns over the amount of time that it might take. A member stated that they liked the accountability of having the nomination come from the area that knows the member best. A member stated that he would not be comfortable nominating anyone based solely on his knowledge of the person...that it should come from his home area. A member reminded the committee that this is just for a nomination and that the actual vote would have to go back to the areas. A question was asked of the maker....where did this come from? Has there been a problem? Greg V. stated that it just came from one of the home groups in his area. A member stated that her area might not know an addict from another area. Mike mentioned that we may not have enough guidance in the guidelines on how to challenge a nomination. Point of clarification: this would include all administrative, rcms and subcommittee chair positions. Holly said that there is also a question and answer period after someone expresses willingness.


