IF THE MEDIA OR AN OUTSIDE ORGANIZATION CONTACTS YOU...

It is essential that all public information efforts of Narcotics Anonymous be well planned, prepared and carried out. The clarity and quality of our public image has a direct bearing on whether or not addicts who need us will be able to find us. For that reason, P.I. efforts must be undertaken with patient, careful planning.

In order to handle requests for Public Information in the Greater Smoky Mountain area, we have set up a Contingency Plan:

- 1) ANY NA MEMBER RECEIVING A REQUEST FOR INFORMATION FROM AN OUTSIDE CONTACT SHOULD IMMEDIATELY CALL:

- 2) EITHER OF THE METHODS ABOVE WILL ALLOW US TO RESPOND TO THE CONTACT WITHIN AN EIGHT-HOUR PERIOD.
- 3) WHEN A REQUEST IS MADE BY THE MEDIA, THE PUBLIC INFORMATION SUBCOMMITTEE WILL HANDLE THE REQUEST.
- 4) IF IT'S DEEMED APPROPRIATE, THE VOLUNTEER REGION OR WORLD TRUSTED SERVANTS MAY HANDLE THE REQUEST, THE APPROPRIATE ONE WILL BE CONTACTED.
- 5) THERE ARE SOME BASIC RULES IN PUBLIC INFORMATION THAT NEED TO BE UNDERSTOOD BY EVERY NA MEMBER:
 - NEVER DO **OUTSIDE** SPEAKING ENGAGEMENTS
 - NEVER DO MEDIA INTERVIEWS ON YOUR OWN!!!

OPEN FORUM

Topic #1

Walker- anyone wanting to use Emerald Avenue Methodist Church to hold a meeting or NA function needs to go through Hugs Not Drugs or Just For Today to get permission. Lately we have had some problems with people not cleaning up after they held an event there.

Topic #2

Rex- I would like to apologize for my behavior last night at Saturday Night Live. I let someone get under my skin. As a result of last night's occurrence, our home group has decided to ban Jeff B. from attending our meeting. If he chooses to return, he will be escorted off the premises and the police will be called. We are planning on getting a restraining order as well.

Donna- Letting the police handle that issue with a restraining order would probably be a better alternative than handling the issue on your own.

Topic #3

Karen- Just for Today is holding a Valentine's Day Dance on February 10th at 6 p.m. We will eat, have a speaker and dance afterwards. The price is \$4 for a single and \$7 per couple.

Topic #4

David- I have a concern. We had an ad-hoc committee to revise the by-laws but they were voted down twice. Did they not pass because of a specific reason?

Melanie- Our home group voted no because they were too vague. The revised by-laws were adapted from the by-laws of a smaller area; we did not feel like they covered everything that concerns our area.

Greg- The revised guidelines by themselves would not have been adequate, all of our literature would have to have been involved, such as the Guide to Local Service.

Topic #5

Leesa- On page 4 of our current by-laws, it clearly states what all should be included in the group reports. In the past, at area we used to give each home group an opportunity to verbally give their report. I think it would be a good idea to go back to doing this. It would allow the area to focus on the support of its home groups. It would also be a good means of communicating which groups needed support.

Melanie- In lieu of open forum, we could let the GSR's report on the status of the home groups.

Greg- This is one of the things that were in the revised version of the by-laws

Betty- On the topic of group reports, at my home group's last group conscience we noticed that the group reports had been changed without anyone knowing beforehand. Should changes such as this be discussed with the area first?

Leesa- In the Guide to Local Service, it states that the secretary must get the minutes to the GSR's. It contains no specificity as to the form of the minutes.

Karen- In a past area meeting, didn't we decide that it was up to the home groups as to what information they included on their group reports?

Topic #6

Max- So now that the revised by-laws have failed, do we go back to using the original set of by-laws?

James- The original by-laws had never been eliminated. We have been and will continue to use them.

Phil- So does this now mean that the home groups can now make motions to change individual items in the by-laws?

James- Yes

Ivan- From my experience, an ad-hoc committee is, in this situation, is supposed to revise the by-laws and bring them back to present to the area. The area would then send them to the home groups to generate suggestions and

further revisions. The ad-hoc committee would then incorporate the home groups' suggestions into the by-laws and then bring this back to the area. This process would continue until an acceptable version of the by-laws had been created.

John- I would like to thank the secretary for the hard work put into the minutes. I did receive a copy of the minutes but I did not see where we were supposed to vote on the regional positions.

Chris- Maybe what Donna is talking about would work. Like a "voting page". In the old days we prayed before group conscience. You don't see that anymore.

Stephen- Just a suggestion, in the minutes, put some type of recognizable identifier next to the items that require a vote.

John- Angie, I apologize; now I see the regional nominations in the minutes.

Angie- I apologize if it is confusing. I'm doing the best job that I can. From now on, I will be sure to put an indicator next to the items requiring a vote.

Rex- I just want to let everyone know that you can review the new 6th edition Basic Text on the world's website.

Topic #9

Chris- What specifically does one have to do to get banned from a meeting?

Rex- In accordance with the 4th Tradition, our group felt that this particular person was exhibiting behavior that was not conducive to recovery.

Jon- My personal opinion is that calling the police on someone at a meeting is not right.

Betty- We have a home group member that wants to re-establish the home group banner exchange.

James- We are no longer going to pursue adopting the revised by-laws. If the existing by-laws need to be revised, we can do it line-by-line by bringing motions to area.

Intent: To carry the message of Narcotics Anonymous where our fellowship has never dared to go before in a way that best suits addicts in their countries.

Pro- the countries pay the expenses. Con- we don't have enough information to release the copyright. Note—All translations are difficult, go to the web and see where translations have been made. If we allow this words could be lost. In most countries the translation would be lost trying to convey what our words are saying. There is an IP on this, no one could remember the #.
